Children's Summer Workshop to Present Oliver!

Oliver! is a musical based on a classic Charles Dickens novel, and focuses on a young, innocent orphan who lives in a workhouse (orphanage) because his mother died during childbirth. He experiences the rough homeless side of London with its dangers, but manages to befriend the Artful Dodger, who brings him into Fagin's kitchen. There, the boys are learning to cope on the streets and become pickpockets for Fagin. However, Oliver is captured by the police in a pickpocketing scheme, even though he is innocent. The man who was the victim takes him in and cares for him, and learns that Oliver is his grandson. However, the gang from the other side of town wants Oliver back and plots to get him, fearful that he will rat them out. In addition, those at the workhouse learn through a death-

them out. In addition, those at the workhouse learn through a deathbed confession that Oliver was born from a wealthy family, and also plot to get him back. All schemes fail, and Oliver is eventually reunited with his grandfather for a happy ending.

FUNDRAISING UPDATE

We began our fundraising efforts last year with the Kroger Plus Card. The patio is scheduled to be installed in mid-May, in time for a grand reveal during the May 20th Annual Membership meeting. Brick sales have been going on for the past three months, and we are very pleased with the response. The funds raised from the brick sales and other fundraising efforts will go toward capital improvements in the theater.

Our first goal is to replace the current banquetstyle chairs in the auditorium. While these chairs have served us well, they have seen a lot of use and are starting to become uncomfortable. After replacing the chairs, the Board is working on a list of other capital improvements for our aging theater.

All plans are to either enhance the theatre experience for our guests, or to help preserve our building for the next generation of LSC members. We hope to see you at the Annual Membership meeting in May, and, weather- permitting we can enjoy viewing your name in the "Spotlight."

Building on the success of *The Producers*, Tom Cavano has assembled an award-winning production team that is already working on bringing the next Mel Brooks musical comedy to life: *Young Frankenstein – The Musical*. This musical comedy follows the story of Dr. Fredrick Frankenstein as he reluctantly takes over the family business of re-animating life in a Transylvania castle.

The production is based on the classic Mel Brooks movie comedy of the same name, and features all of its beloved characters. NEW MEMBERSHIP DUES

As we anticipate a deficit in our budget for the fiscal year 2014-2015, we have unfortunately found it necessary to increase our membership dues and our ticket prices, effective immediately. Increases In the cost of heating, air conditioning, water, lighting, and insurance are all contributing to this deficit, as well as the cost of producing quality shows, to say nothing of our mortgage.

At the April meeting, the Board of Directors voted to increase the membership dues to \$15.00 for an individual and \$25.00 for a couple. Your membership in LSC allows us to maintain our quality theatre programming and our status as one of the best community theatres in the area.

For those same reasons, we must increase our ticket prices as well. Our Summer Children's Theatre Workshop ticket price will now be \$12.00 per ticket ,and our regular season ticket price will increase to \$18.00 per ticket. Those prices are still very competitive with other community theatres in the area.


