



The Future

The 2017-2018 Season has been determined. Once again the Loveland Stage Company is presenting a WIDE range of productions.

Our Summer Children's Workshop is expanding to TWO productions. The first, for ages 8 to 13, is *Willy Wonka Jr.*, followed immediately by *Pippin* for ages 12 to 20. Be sure to watch our website and Facebook pages for auditions and show dates. Directed by Glenna Knapp.

In November, we start out with the musical powerhouse, *Cabaret*. Next Spring we are offering two shows: 9 to 5, The Musical, directed by Denise Schnieders; and the play, Don't Drink The Water, directed by John Sloan. Be sure to see both of these great comedies!


