CABARET

Cabaret is a musical based on a novel by Christopher Isherwood, with music by John Kander and lyrics by Fred Ebb. The 1966 Broadway production became a hit, inspiring numerous subsequent productions in London and New York, as well as the 1972 film by the same name.

It is based on John Van Druten's 1951 play I Am a Camera, which was adapted from the short novel Goodbye to Berlin (1939) by Christopher Isherwood. Set in 1929 Berlin as the Nazis are rising to power, it is based in nightlife at the seedy Kit Kat Klub, and revolves around young American writer Cliff Bradshaw and his relationship with 32-year-old English cabaret performer Sally Bowles.

A sub-plot involves the doomed romance between German boarding house owner Fräulein Schneider and her elderly suitor Herr Schultz, a Jewish fruit vendor. Overseeing the action is the Master of Ceremonies at the Kit Kat Klub. The club serves as a metaphor for ominous political developments in late Weimar Germany.



The Long And Winding Road...To A Marquee by Bob Kessler, LSC President

At the November 2015 Loveland Stage Company Board meeting, I brought up the idea of a three-sided Marquee to eliminate the visibility problem created by the Loveland Station Apartments. I had sat down at my computer and designed a simple canopy that I hoped would pass the scrutiny of the Board, as well as the various City officials who would have to approve the project. The Board reaction was enthusiastic (who wouldn't want something that showcased our theatre!). So began a two-year-long project which reached a successful conclusion at the recent Board Meeting, when we dedicated the new marquee with a lighting ceremony!

In order to get the necessary approvals, I first had to find a structural engineer who would take my ideas and determine how best to build it. I settled on Steve Schaefer of Schaefer & Associates, a company I had worked with for years through my company, Kessler Studios. Steve was great, working within a tight budget and willing to make the many necessary revisions that inevitably came up.

With blueprints in hand, I had to navigate the appeal process, getting variances from both the Board of Zoning Appeals and the Zoning Board. Eva Sigel, Building & Zoning Coordinator for the City of Loveland, guided me though that phase, providing invaluable advice. Everyone seemed excited at the prospect of a lighted marquee, making my "appeals" seem more like formalities.

Once I had the approvals, I went back to the Board with a budget: \$8000 - \$10,000 for materials. I emphasized that even though the price was high, I was confident that we would be able to eventually fund-raise from the membership. In April of 2017, I was given the official go-ahead by the Board. I wanted to build the marquee between the Summer Youth Workshops and the November 2017 production.

After a lot of research, haggling, and cajoling, I lined up a group of material suppliers and LSC member volunteers. The bulk of the work would take place during a two-week period in July, but I spent many hours "prepping" the building by drilling holes for structural elements beforehand. Once the July start-date hit, it was 14+ days of intense activity. We seemed to pick the hottest two weeks of the year and the sun was merciless! Nonetheless, a steady group of volunteers showed up and we tore down the old sign and erected the canopy, which would eventually hold the sign boxes. THANKS TO ALL THE FOLKS WHO CAME OUT TO GET THE JOB DONE!!

After the canopy was completed, we ordered the sign boxes and they were installed in late August. After wiring the can lights and signs, we passed our final two inspections (electric & building) in early September. On Tuesday, September 19th, the Board held a Lighting Ceremony and the new LSC Marquee came officially to life!




