



ELECTIONS ELECTIONS

The Board has announced that our annual General Meeting will be held on Tuesday, September 15th (time to be announced). Our annual board elections will take place from the close of the meeting through September 22nd (cut off time to be announced). There are 5 seats up for election.

We are living in unusual times and we are all doing all we can to protect our own health and the health of our neighbors. These concerns along with mandated safety procedures have necessitated a different approach to holding our annual meeting and elections. After extensive research (many groups have recently held their meetings and elections in the last several months) and examination of our bylaws, the board has come up with the following method for our meeting and elections.

Our General Meeting will be held virtually. For those of you who do not use computers, a monitor will be set up at the Stage Company. **All social distancing guidelines will be strictly enforced and masks will be required.** Some of you may choose to gather with a friend or two at home and participate together in the meeting. Details will be announced shortly.

All dues must be paid by the meeting date in order for a member to vote in the election (more on voting below). In the next week, there will be a "button" on our web page that will allow you to pay via credit card or PayPal. As always, you can mail your dues to **The Loveland Stage Company, PO Box 312, Loveland OH 45140.** They must be received by September 14th. A locked "mail box" has been installed to the left of the green room doors. You may drop you membership form and dues in the box anytime. Lastly, there will be several time slots set up for you to bring your dues to the theater. A membership form can be found on the following page.

Voting will take place from the close of the meeting through September 22nd. At the conclusion of our meeting, ballots will be emailed to all paid members. The electronic method used will be one that has been used successfully for elections in our region. There will also be specific times for you to stop by the theater and vote in person if you do not have an email address.

Election candidates and their bios, as well as complete details, will be in the next issue of *The Prompter* the third week of August, as well as posted on our website.

PRO-BONO TREASURER NEEDED:

<u>The Position:</u> The Loveland Stage Company is seeking a knowledgeable person for the position of Treasurer. Starting not later than October 1, 2020.

<u>Background:</u> The Loveland Stage Company (LSC) is a non-profit, 501(c)(3) corporation with annual revenue in excess of \$100,000. The organization is dedicated to serving our community by providing quality theater and performing arts experiences. The group has been in existence for over 40 years and operates out of a historic building in the picturesque town of Loveland, Ohio. The group produces 4-5 major plays a year, as well as hosting a summer youth-camp program and a Christmas Show. The all-volunteer company is full of talented, dedicated and fun people who all share a passion for live theater.

<u>The Job Description:</u> The Treasurer is responsible for providing financial direction to and maintaining the financial books and records for the Loveland Stage Company. The Treasurer is an appointed member of the Board of Directors. The preferred candidate will have accounting background and skills. Knowledge of non-profits is a bonus!

As Treasurer, you will have these tasks:

- 1. Maintain the financial books and records of the Loveland Stage Company. (QuickBooks is the financial software used, and a copy is provided.)
- 2. Disburse funds for all expenses (usually via online banking).
- 3. Present financial position of the Company at monthly Board meetings.
- 4. Advise the LSC on annual and per-show budgets to maintain sound fiscal stability of the organization as well as accounting and tax related requirements.
- 5. Prepare (or assist) year-end filings for Federal and State agencies, as required by law including Tax Return (Form 990) and 1099s.
- 6. Maintain banking and other financially related relationships. (Banking GE Credit Union, PayPal, utilities accounts, etc.)
- 7. Check PO Box at Loveland Post Office about once a week.

The Time Commitment:

Generally, the position of Treasurer entails a few hours per week making payments and/or deposits and maintain appropriate entries in QuickBooks. Monthly reports are prepared with the accounting software. Board meetings are once a month and generally take about 2 hours. At the moment meetings are Virtual, but eventually the in-person type will resume.

The current Treasurer will be available to help with the transition and can answer questions about procedures. The position "officially" begins on October 1st of 2020, but the transition can start asap.



Director Notes for The Importance of Being Earnest

Oscar Wilde is known for his wit and use of the English language. This particular play of his was met with so much fanfare and hype, it is sad to know that it was also the beginning of his downfall from social grace. Wilde's use of comedy is still strong, many finding Lady Bracknell's response of "A Handbag?" as one of the funniest lines used by a playwright. Though, one can argue that it is also the way in which the actor has delivered the line. We can discuss this point at another time.

I changed up the genders of those who were reading the characters to allow the listener a new take on what Wilde had to say about the sexes. When you read the lines, as intended, it is the usual take on the male/female relationship. But to hear a male voice say "How absurd to talk of the equality of the sexes! Where questions of self-sacrifice are concerned, men are infinitely beyond us" takes on a whole new meaning. Was this a point of contention, or simply a viewpoint at the time? It is very interesting to hear the differences of the lines when gender was taken out and not the focus.



About Orchid Awards

OCTA (Ohio Community Theater Association); holds annual regional theater competitions. The Southwest Region of OCTA (of which Cincinnati is a part) is one of the largest in the Ohio with 20 plus theater groups as members.

ACT (Association of Community Theater); upon request by a member community theater group, will send three responders to critique all aspects of a production, from cast members performances to lobby displays, from technical aspects to program design. This 'Responder/Judging program' was created to encourage the continued growth and development of quality community theater through a process of positive feedback, constructive criticism, and peer recognition. It is hoped that each critique will provide useful tips and feedback that performers and production staff can draw from on future theatrical endeavors. Part of peer recognition is the presentation of Orchid Awards at the annual Southwest Regional banquet. To be Considered nominated for an Orchid Award one responder has to nominate the person, group or aspect, for the award. If two or three responders nominate then the Orchid Award is won.





About COLE

Cole Porter, one of the outstanding American composer-lyricists of the 20th century, was born in Peru, Indiana in 1891, the only son of Samuel and Kate Porter.

His early life was dominated by the strong personalities of his mother, who determined he should pursue a career as a musician, and maternal grandfather, a rich landowner. Porter was educated at Worcester Academy, Massachusetts and then at Yale where his musical talents found ideal scope in the Glee Club and the Yale Drama, for which he wrote several musical comedies, as well as writing songs for the football team (which are still sung at Yale). Lasting college friends included Monty Woolley, with whom he collaborated in later work.

After Yale he began studying law at Harvard at his grandfather's insistence, but later switched to music. His first full-scale professional production was the comic opera *See America First*, which had a brief Broadway run in 1916. For the next 12 years, his life was spent mostly abroad. His Broadway career began in earnest with *Paris* (1928) and *Fifty Million Frenchmen* (1929), the successes of which ended his expatriate period. The '30s saw a remarkable succession of Cole Porter hits on Broadway, including *Gay Divorcee* with Fred Astaire (1932), *Anything Goes* (1934), *Jubilee* (1935), *Red Hot and Blue* (1936) and *Du Barry Was A Lady* with Ethel Merman and Bert Lahr (1939). He also worked in Hollywood in the '30s, with original film scores including *Born to Dance* (1936) and *Rosalie* (1937).

In 1938 he suffered a serious riding accident, which dogged him for the rest of his life. However, his career continued in both theatre and film, with *Kiss Me Kate* (1948), *Can-Can* (1953), and *Silk Stockings* (1955). His Hollywood work during his later career included *The Pirate* (1948), *High Society* (1956) and *Les Girls* (1957). His health deteriorating during his last years, Cole Porter died in October, 1964 in Santa Monica.

Cole will take you on a musical journey from Porter's days at Yale through his time in Paris, New York and Hollywood. The production maintains the feel of 1920s through 1950s elegance.



Gypsy is a 1959 musical with music by Jule Styne, lyrics by Stephen Sondheim, and a book by Arthur Laurents. Gypsy is loosely based on the 1957 memoirs of Gypsy Rose Lee, the famous striptease artist, entitled Gypsy: Memoirs of America's Most Celebrated Stripper and focuses on her mother, Rose, whose name has become synonymous with "the ultimate show business mother."

Gypsy tells the story of the dreams and efforts of one hungry, powerhouse of a woman to get her two daughters into show business. It follows the dreams and efforts of Rose to raise two daughters to perform onstage and casts an affectionate eye on the hardships of show business life. The character of Louise is based on Lee, and the character of June is based on Lee's sister, the actress June Havoc.

Gypsy is famous for helping launch lyricist Stephen Sondheim's career, and features a book by Arthur Laurents that is widely considered to be one of the classic examples of a traditional "book musical." At the heart of the musical is the gregarious Rose, whose journey made critic Frank Rich call Gypsy, "Broadway's own brassy, unlikely answer to King Lear."

The musical features songs that have become standards of the musical theatre canon, including "Some People," "Let Me Entertain You," "Rose's Turn," and the show-stopping "Everything's Coming Up Roses".

It is frequently considered one of the crowning achievements of the mid-twentieth century's conventional musical theatre art form. *Gypsy* has been referred to as the greatest American musical by numerous critics and writers, among them Ben Brantley who wrote "what may be the greatest of all American musicals...". Theater critic Clive Barnes wrote that "*Gypsy* is one of the best of musicals..." and described Rose as "one of the few truly complex characters in the American musical."
